Deacon Outreach Ministry

Community Baking Ministry: Bakers gather in church kitchen to bake cookies for KAIROS Prison Ministry and for community outreach efforts which share God's love;

Coupon Clippers: Clip pages of manufacturer's coupons from newspapers to be distributed to military families based overseas for use in the post exchanges;

Family Promise Team: Provide meals, be an overnight host, set up and/or break down guests' rooms, and/or spend time with families who are temporarily homeless when FPC serves as a host congregation four weeks/year;

Kairos Prison Ministry: Teams of men go into local prisons and share the gospel of Jesus Christ;

Youth/Young Adult Ministry: Outreach to our college students and members serving in the military.

Flower Ministry

Arrange and/or deliver flowers to members in the hospital or at home.

Health Ministries Team

This team promotes "holistic" care by empowering individuals to be responsible stewards of God's gift of life through wellness of body, mind and spirit. Both medical and non-medical volunteers are welcome.

Blood Drive Volunteers: Lend a hand with promoting the drive and/or baking cookies to be served to blood donors;

Caring Friends: Offer non-medical companionship/respite for caregivers. Each volunteer offers two hours/month and caregivers can receive help three to four times/month from different volunteers;

Fitness with Friends: Exercise class M-W-F 8:30 - 9:30 a.m. in the Fellowship Hall or Gathering Space;

Health Care Professional Volunteers: Serve in the Health Ministries office Wednesdays 11:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m. (time is optional) to administer blood pressure checks and/or make phone calls to FPC members who are chronically ill and those recently hospitalized. Attend Health Ministries monthly meetings;

Inspiring Wellness: A subcommittee of Health Ministries assists in designing, planning and implementing church/community health initiatives, meetings, conferences and support groups.

Knitting Ministry

Knit or crochet prayer shawls and special project items to convey care and support in times of need or joy.

Lay Visitation Ministry

Lay Visitation is a ministry of friendship and caring for those in our congregation who have been recently hospitalized, have health issues which lead to confinement at home or in a care facility; or who can no longer actively participate in the life of our faith community. One-on-one visitation provides comfort, a listening ear and a warm smile. Volunteer to brighten someone's day, perhaps your own.

Meals from the Heart

This ministry is designed to support FPC members who may be facing a crisis in their lives and are in need of caring concern and a friendly smile.

Bereavement/Recovery Meals: Prepare a dish on short notice as part of a dinner delivered to a family which has lost a loved one; or for a member recently hospitalized; or returning from rehabilitation/nursing facilities;

Cooks: Gather in the church kitchen several times a year to prepare chicken pot pies and soups for members in need.

Memorial Reception Team

Volunteers provide nourishment and comfort to families who have lost a loved one by preparing a beautiful reception following memorial services. Men and women alike are invited to share in this ministry.

Prayer Ministry Team

This team provides prayer for anyone who seeks it.

Love Letters: On Sundays in the Gathering Space you will find "love letters" that are created specifically for those experiencing a challenge in their lives;

Prayer Chain: Pray daily for church members and friends;

Prayer Project: The Prayer Project is a short-term opportunity for every member in our church to experience the love and support of someone praying on their behalf during the summer. The responsibility of the Prayer Friend is simply to pray for several people every day through the summer.

Session


Clerk of Session: Michele Green (843-686-5029)

As there were in *Old Testament* times elders for the government of the people, so the *New Testament* church provided persons with particular gifts to share in the discernment of God's Spirit and governance of God's people. Accordingly, congregations should elect persons of wisdom and maturity of faith, having demonstrated skills in leadership and being compassionate in spirit.

Ruling Elders are chosen by the congregation to discern and measure its fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life. Not only are ruling elders responsible for the life of the congregation but for the church as a whole, including ecumenical relationships. (*Book of Order 2015-2017*)

The Session has 27 Ruling Elders and offers multiple opportunities for which you can volunteer.

Special Event Bakers: Bake cookies, muffins and/or cupcakes for special events as needed;

Volunteer Connection Team: Make calls to thank FPC members throughout the year;

Outreach Ministry

Outreach Ministry evaluates and establishes mission-oriented programs that extend the ministry of Jesus Christ and the church to local, regional and global communities.

Global Outreach

A team that coordinates and supports FPC's global outreach endeavors, focusing primarily on the following countries:

Congo: FPC partners with the Congo Presbyterian Church and Christian Medical Institute of Kasai (IMCK) through support of mission co-workers, projects such as new water systems and building the chapel at IMCK, visits and in prayer;

Haiti: Partners with Haiti Outreach Ministries (HOM) to support faith-based communities in the suburbs of Port au Prince, Haiti. Each community contains a church, school, clean water supply, nutritional support and job training. Mission team opportunities exist in support of healthcare delivery, construction and education. Teams stay in a HOM guest house, dine with our Haitian partners and work in the HOM communities;

Kenya: Become part of a team that supports relationships and provides scholarship funding for homeless students in the Bahati area of Nairobi, Kenya;

Nicaragua: Participate in short-term mission outreach projects onsite in Nicaragua; working with House of Hope, a refuge to get women and children off the street; and New Life, an orphanage and nutrition center for pre-school malnourished children, and helping to build small houses for needy families.



Local Outreach

A team that identifies and supports local outreach opportunities.

Annual School Uniform Drive: Help with coordinating, sorting and distributing donated school uniforms to children in local school districts;

BackPack Buddies: An interfaith community program, BPB provides food for students in the Hilton Head and Ridgeland elementary schools who are on reduced or free lunch programs in a backpack with nutritious, child-friendly food for the weekend. In addition to monetary support, volunteers pick up, pack and deliver food to the schools. In 2015 the program served 273 local children.

Book Buddies: An adult group of any venue adopts a 3rd, 4th or 5th grade class at Ridgeland Elementary School. The adults write to the children, and in turn the children respond with letters. The letter writing continues throughout the school year, which helps with reading and writing. Books can be purchased using our Scholastic book company partnership and donated to the class;

Bookinators: Volunteer tutors and mentors needed for developing reading and understanding skills with students at Ridgeland Elementary School in Jasper County. Help in some measure to turn the Corridor of Shame into the Corridor of Hope;

Books 'n Bucks: A spring event when books are collected for needy public schools in South Carolina. This requires advertising, receiving and distributing books to schools to supplement their libraries;

Fellowship of Christian Athletes: Work with local middle and high school coaches and athletes through outreach ministries;

First Books of Beaufort: The mission of this program is to ensure that every 4-year-old in Title 1 pre-schools and Head Start Centers in Beaufort County has books in his or her home. FBB sponsors monthly interactive story hours during the school year for 4-year-olds;

GED Program: Help people obtain their General Education Development Certificate by serving as a teacher/mentor in one of the following subjects: math, reading/language arts, social studies and science.

Kairos Prison Ministry: A group of men volunteer two weekends per year to spend with the inmates at Allendale Prison. This is a spiritual time used to bring inmates to Christ;

People in Need: Volunteers needed Tuesday mornings in the church office offering assistance to people who need help with rent, food, utilities and medical expenses. Training is provided;

Presbyterian Communities: Volunteer liaison needed for updates and ongoing needs of this non-profit service enabling retirees to live with dignity and independence;

Local Outreach (cont'd)

Thanksgiving and Christmas Baskets: Work with David Martin at Piggly Wiggly Supermarket in Coligny Plaza ordering food for baskets. Transport is needed to bring the baskets to church and help with distribution;

Thornwell Home for Children: Contact Thornwell to determine items needed. Plan and develop Christmas display with information on how to fill needs for children and cottages. Gifts need to be transported to Clinton, SC prior to Christmas.

Community Outreach

Share your faith through service in our local community.

Antioch Educational Center (AEC): This unique program supports adults and children through nursing assistance training programs; summer work programs for Jr./Sr. high school students; a scholars pilot program for first graders designed to follow students through high school; also has developed food distribution with a local BackPack buddies program and assists students with school uniforms. Volunteers and financial supported needed;

Bargain Box: Volunteer at the island's charity thrift store, which sells gently used, donated items at bargain prices;

Boys and Girls Club: Inspire and enable local young people to realize their full potential as productive, responsible and caring citizens. Help with homework is always needed, as well;

Boy Scout Troop #245: Help busy scouts with miscellaneous tasks and projects;

Brain Gain: Volunteer in a summer cultural, educational and recreational program for high-achieving, low-income children;

Community Christmas Day Dinner: An annual free event for islanders and visitors to share dinner and fellowship and celebrate Christ's birthday;

Deep Well: Help those in need, disabled and infirm to overcome adversity through a range of vital social services;

Habitat for Humanity: Build affordable housing in the upcoming island project, "The Glen," assist with current remodels or volunteer at the ReStore in Bluffton;

Homelessness Task Force: Build public awareness of local hunger and homelessness issues;

Hope Haven: Assist in providing miscellaneous services for adult and child victims of abuse;

Community Outreach (cont'd)

The Literacy Center: Assist in equipping adults with reading, writing and math skills;

Memory Matters: Provides comprehensive services to those afflicted with any type of dementia AND their families;

Mentor a Student: Provide consistent support, guidance and help to a student in need of a positive role model in local schools through the IMPACT mentoring program;

Sandalwood Food Pantry: Assemble and distribute food, clothing and other necessities to local people in need;

Soup Kitchens: There are three (3) opportunities to volunteer at soup kitchens: Grateful Hearts Soup Kitchen at Holy Family Catholic Church on Mondays and Wednesdays; St. James Soup Kitchen at St. James Baptist Church on Thursdays; and the Campbell Chapel AME Baptist Church in Bluffton on Thursdays. Help the hungry and homeless by assisting in set-ups, donation of side dishes, and clean-up - volunteers and financial assistance welcome;

Volunteers in Medicine: Greet/direct patients, help with medical records or personnel at an all-volunteer medical clinic providing health care to uninsured local residents;

Young Life: Help in a non-denominational mentoring and fellowship program designed to anchor teenagers.



First Presbyterian Day School

Grocery Shoppers: Shop weekly for lunch and snack items;

Handyman: Help with small projects, such as minor construction and painting;

Playground Maintenance: Repair minor breaks and power wash climbing equipment two times/year;

Substitute Teacher: Fill in for teachers when ill or on vacation;

Window Washing: Clean windows in the classrooms by washing two to three times/year.

Worship

Worship is the main entry to FPC for new visitors and seekers, as well as a source of awakening and renewal for our existing members and regular attendees. Volunteer to provide support before, during and after worship services.

Chancel Guild Team: Straighten pews, refill pew holders, friendship pads and children's worship bags in the sanctuary each week;

Christmas Eve Ushers:

Christmas Eve services: 5:00 p.m., 8:00 p.m., 10:00 p.m.;

Communion Cleanup Team: Assist with cleanup following worship:

Traditional: 8:30 a.m., 11:00 a.m.; or Contemporary: 9:45 a.m.;

Communion Prep Team: Help prepare the elements the day before Communion: Traditional or Contemporary;

Contemporary Video Clips: Research video clips for worship services and special programs for the 9:45 a.m. service;

Contemporary Worship Support Team: Assist with planning and tasks as needed for the 9:45 a.m. service;

Poinsettia Watering Volunteers: Help is needed watering our beautiful Christmas poinsettias every few days during Advent;

Seasonal Decorations: Assist in enhancing the beauty of our church seasonally (Lent, Easter and Advent);

Soundboard Support Team: Provide sound support on Sunday and during special services. Training is provided;

Special Service Ushers: Memorials, concerts, etc.;

Tech/Media Support Team: Help with technical preparation/presentation and/or laptop support for Sunday services in the sanctuary and Fellowship Hall, and for special programs. Training is provided;

Ushers: Join an usher team serving throughout the year. Services: 8:30 a.m., 9:45 a.m., 11:00 a.m.



Music Ministry

Carillon Handbell Choir: Perform with a choir of adult ringers throughout the year. Training is available. Rehearsals are Thursdays at 5:30 p.m.;

Children's Choir Helpers*: Help provide a safe and loving learning environment for children;

Choir Librarians: Assist in cataloging and filing choir music;

Contemporary Music Team: Sing with the Contemporary Worship Team;

Inspi-Ringers*: A handbell choir for children ages 7 and up;
