200 ***God's Promise: I Am With You*** (2018) (Presbyterian Women). Amy Poling Sutherland takes readers on a nine-lesson journey through scripture to consider how God's promise ("I will be with you"/"I am with you") speaks to our circumstances, as individuals and a community. We will also consider Jesus' own promise of presence to his followers as he sends us into this world. As we explore the many facets of this most profound gift, we will ask, how does God's promise of presence change us and the way we live? *Materials include: 1 book and 1 DVD.*

210 ***Tough Questions*** (2003) **Garry Poole & Judson Poling**. The leader guide will help you steer your small group toward a greater understanding of the Christian faith. Together, you will explore the power and preeminence of Jesus and the truth he brought to light. *Materials include: 1 leader guide and 3 individual studies: "Why Become a Christian", "How Reliable is the Bible" and "Don't All Religions Lead to God", ea. w/6-session participant guides.*

220 ***Cloud of Witnesses: The Community of Christ in Hebrews*** (2017) (Presbyterian Women) **Melissa Bane Sevier** decided to approach the letter to the Hebrews thematically, not sequentially. You will explore nine major themes, relate those themes to other parts of your faith tradition, and tie them together with the overarching motif of community. *Materials include: 1 study guide with 9 lessons.*

220 ***God's Promise: I Am with You*** (2018) (Presbyterian Women) In this study **Amy Poling Sutherlin** traces God's recurring promise of presence from Genesis through the Gospels. *Good women's study with 9 lessons. Materials include: 1 DVD & study guide.*

220 ***Journey with Me*** (2015) **Randall Lolley**. A collection of sermons, one for each book of the Bible. Former students, parishioners, friends, and colleagues-now spread far and wide - are better Christians and better Baptists because of Randall Lolley. *Materials include: 2 books with study guide after each chapter.*

220 ***Who Is Jesus? What a Difference a Lens Makes*** (2016) (Presbyterian Women) **Judy Yates Siker**. Halfway through the Gospel of Mark, as Jesus and his disciples are on their way to Caesarea Philippi, Jesus turns to his disciples and asks, "So, what's the word on the street? Who do people say that I am?" *Materials include: 1 study guide with 9 lessons.*

220.7 ***The Story: The Bible as One Continuing Story of God and His People*** (2021) by Zondervan (Author). God goes to great lengths to rescue lost and hurting people. That is what *The Story* is all about: the story of the Bible, God's great love affair with humanity. *The Story* sweeps you into the unfolding progression of Bible characters and events from Genesis to Revelation. Like any good story, *The Story* is filled with intrigue, drama, conflict, romance, and redemption - and this story is true! *Materials include: 2 books, 2 study guides and 2 DVDs.*

220.9 ***Bad Girls of the Bible and What We Can Learn from Them*** (2013) **Liz Curtis Higgs**. In looking at what we can learn from biblical women gone bad through her "novel approach to Bible study," Liz brings to life ancient stories and unforgettably reveals how timeless truths of the Bible apply to today's woman. With more than 1 million books sold in the series, this newly repackaged edition appeals to women of all ages and stages of Christian faith. *Materials include: 1 book with study guide.*

220.9 ***The Women of the Bible Speak: The Wisdom of 16 Women and Their Lessons for Today*** (2021) Author **Shannon Bream** outlines the lessons we can take from the valor of Esther, the hope of Hannah, the audacity of Rahab, and the faith of Mary. In broadening each woman's individual story, Shannon offers us a deeper understanding of each, and wisdom and insights that can transform our own lives today. *Materials include: 3 books with study questions at the end of each chapter.*

221 ***The Bible from Scratch: The Old Testament for Beginners*** (2016) **Donald L. Griggs** has written an accessible, easy-to-understand high level overview of the Bible for adults who have - or fear they have - little or no Bible knowledge. *Materials include: 7 sessions, participant book with leader guide in-back-of book.*

221 ***Invitation to the Old Testament*** (2005) **Celia Brewer Sinclair & James D. Tabor**. This study approaches the Hebrew Scriptures by inviting participants to hear the story of God and God's calling of the people of Israel through the many "voices" of the biblical text. *Materials include: a good leader guide, 8-session participant book and DVD.*

222.3 ***The Girl's Still Got It: Take a Walk with Ruth and the God Who Rocked Her World*** (2012) **Liz Curtis Higgs**. Walk with Ruth as she travels from Moab to Bethlehem, certain of her calling, yet uncertain of her future. Hold Naomi's hand and watch love put the pieces of her broken life back together. And hang out with Boaz, their kinsman-redeemer, who blesses both women and honors God, big time. You'll tarry in the corners of their ancient houses, listen to their conversations, and consider every word of every verse until you can say, "I *totally* get the book of Ruth. Think of it as time travel without gimmicks, gizmos, or a DeLorean: a novel approach to Bible study that leaps from past to present, gleaning timeless truths that speak to the heart. *Materials include: 1 book.*

223.2 ***A Long Obedience in the Same Direction***. (2023) Since **Eugene Peterson** wrote this spiritual formation classic more than forty years ago, hundreds of thousands of Christians have been inspired by its call to deeper discipleship. Our society is still obsessed with quick fixes. But Peterson's time-tested prescription for discipleship remains the same - a long obedience in the same direction. Following Jesus requires a deepening life of prayer, and throughout history Christians have learned to pray from the Psalms. Peterson finds particular encouragement for today's pilgrims in the Songs of Ascents (Psalms 120-134). With prophetic and pastoral wisdom, he shows how the psalms teach us to grow in worship, service, joy, work, humility, community, and blessing. *Materials include: 2 books and 1 leader guide.*

224.5 ***Daniel*** (2006) Join **Beth Moore** in a faith-building study of prophecy and learn how to shine for Christ in our modern culture. *Materials include: 12-session study with leader guide and 6 DVDs (one for each chapter), 2 books.*

225 ***Invitation to the New Testament*** (2005) **David A. deSilva & Emerson B. Powery**. Explore the writings of the New Testament using the story of Jesus as the starting point. This survey of the testament looks at how the early church took ownership of and was shaped by the story of Jesus and how the church learned how to develop as disciples and create communities of faith. *Materials include: 8-session participant book, leader guide, DVD.*

225.9 ***The Call: The Life, Ministry and Message of the Apostle Paul*** (2015) With **Adam Hamilton**, we have traced the life of Jesus from his birth The Journey, through his ministry The Way, to his death and resurrection 24 Hours That Changed the World. What happened next? *Materials include: 2 books and 6-session leader guide,*

225.9 ***Strong was Her Faith (Women of the New Testament)*** (2007) **J. Ellsworth Kalas** focuses on several women of great faith who were crucial, in ways both obvious and understated, to the story of the New Testament. *Good women's study. Materials 3 books which include 12 sessions, study guide for leader in-back-of book.*

226 ***John: God in the Flesh*** (2002) **Serendipity House**. Jesus' passion to transform individual lives is seen in all that is revealed in the writings about Him, His teachings, His actions, and His sacrifice. An intriguing approach to Bible study, *best for women. Materials include: 13 sessions, a leader guide built in, 3 books.*

226.8 ***The Prodigal God: Finding Your Place at the Table*** (2009) **Tim Keller** takes you beyond the traditional focus on the wayward younger son. He helps you glean insights from each of the characters in Jesus' parable: the irreligious younger son, the moralistic elder son, and the Father who lavishes his love on both. *Materials include: 6 sessions, discussion guide, 2 DVDs, 2 books, 2 leader guides, participant guide.*

226.8 ***The Prodigal God: Recovering the Heart of the Christian Faith*** (2008) **Tim Keller** takes his trademark intellectual approach to understanding Christianity and uses the parable of the prodigal son to reveal an unexpected message of hope and salvation. *More suited to men's group, narrow focus/deep theology. Materials include: 3 books.*

226.8 ***Short Stories by Jesus: The Enigmatic Parables of a Controversial Rabbi*** (2015) In this wise, entertaining, and educational book, **Amy-Jill Levine** offers a fresh, timely reinterpretation of Jesus' narratives. In *Short Stories by Jesus*, she analyzes these "problems with parables," taking readers back in time to understand how their original Jewish audience understood them. Levine reveals the parables' connections to first-century economic and agricultural life, social customs and morality, Jewish scriptures, and Roman culture. With this revitalized understanding, she interprets these moving stories for the contemporary reader, showing how the parables are not just about Jesus, but are also about us - and when read rightly, still challenge and provoke us two thousand years later. *Materials include: 1 book.*

226.9 ***Companions in Christ: The Way of Blessedness*** (2003) **Stephen D. Bryant**. This study is an invitation for small-group members to discover and live in the kingdom of God. Each week group participants explore one of the Beatitudes from the Sermon on the Mount. *Materials include: 1 leader guide.*

227.2 **First Corinthians** (Interpretation Bible Studies) (2000) **Bruce N. Fisk**. In First Corinthians, Paul writes to a troubled church at Corinth, urging its members to live a life distinct from the ways of others, governed by the law of love, and affirming the tenets of the faith. His direct responses to their shortcomings provide us with a window into daily church life in the first century. But this letter also paints a vivid picture of what any church can become by the grace of God. *Materials include: 1 book.*

227.4 **Philippians and Galatians** (Interpretation Bible Studies) (2001) **Stanley P. Saunders**. The letters to the Philippian and Galatian congregations illustrate well the passion and intensity of Paul's writing. Together these letters provide a compelling portrait of a complex original thinker who probably was the most significant missionary of his day, a theologian and social critic of rare power and insight whose legacy continues today to spark heated debate. *Materials include: 1 book.*

227.6 **Philippians** (2009) **N.T. Wright**. Things don't always go the way we intend. It's easy to feel discouraged because what we hope for is badly thwarted, or because people make life difficult. Paul, writing to the Philippians from prison, certainly knew what it was like to have plans interrupted. But he maintains robust confidence in God's overruling power, even when everything seems to be going wrong. These eight studies will help us learn from Paul the art of seeing God's purposes working out through problems and difficulties and will deepen our own confidence in God's power. *Materials include: 1 book.*

231 **Christian Believer: Knowing God with Heart and Mind** (1999) **J. Ellsworth Kalas**. The *Christian Believer* program focuses on classical teachings of the Christian faith - presenting, explaining, and interpreting them in a way that participants can understand, using words, symbols, and hymns. *More suitable for adult Sunday school class. Materials include: 1 book w/ readings, study manual with 52 sessions and handbook.*

231 **Experiencing God: Knowing and Doing the Will of God** (2007) LifeWay **Claude V. King**. Through examination of biblical and contemporary illustrations, participants will understand and apply seven realities of experiencing God. Churches will be helped to better function as the body of Christ, as members understand how to experience God as a church. *In-depth immersion study. Materials include: 12 (weekly) one-hour sessions, but 5 days of individual study per week.*

231 **Go Fish: Because of What's on the Line** (2005) **Andy Stanley**. Fishing stories, we've all heard them. "It was this big." "You should have seen the one that got away." People love to tell stories about their fishing adventures. When it comes to faith, however, most people clam up. Why is it we can't talk about what God has done in our lives as naturally as we can spin fishing tales? *Evangelism 101. Materials include: 1 study guide complete with leader guide and 6 lessons and 2 DVDs.*

231 **Ten Lies about God and How You Might Already Be Deceived** (2000) **Dr. Erwin Lutzer**. Shattering many modern "misconceptions" about the nature of God, the author serves up a portrait of the divine based solidly on scripture, discussing the significance of God's relationship with humankind, His plans for the world, and more. *10 sessions, good discussion starter. Materials include: 4 books with study guide in-back-of book.*

232 ***Beginning in Christ Together (Experiencing Christ Together)*** (2005) **Brett Eastman and Dee Eastman**. The heart of Christianity is not a ritual or a structure, but a Person - Jesus Christ. But even as his followers, our vision of Jesus can get muddled by man-made theories of who he was. Whether you are a seasoned believer or a brand-new Christian, come walk in the footsteps of his first disciples to see him afresh. *6 sessions, activity oriented, good for home study groups. Materials include: 1 book.*

232 ***He Chose the Nails: What God Did to Win Your Heart*** (2000) **Max Lucado** asks Is your heart unsettled by the chaos of the world? Are you heavy-laden with bad moments, mad moments, or anxious moments? Today, rest in God's self-giving love and leave all your troubles at the foot of the cross. *Materials include in two versions: book: 15 sessions, short prep, lots of application questions in study guide in the back, books and Kit which contains: multimedia 12 sessions, with 5 days of individual study per week, leader guide. Lenten Version: 5 study guides, 5 sessions.*

232 ***I AM: Seven Powerful Claims of Jesus*** (2020) **Rose Visual Bible Studies**. This six-session study examines Jesus' extraordinary claims and shows how Jesus provides, protects, guides, saves, and gives everything we need to grow in spiritual maturity. *Materials include: 2 books which include leader guide.*

232 ***Jesus 101*** **Bill Donahue and Keri Wyatt Kent**. 8 different six-week sessions. Groups could study one of the 6-week topics; discussion based.

232 ***Renegade Gospel: The Rebel Jesus*** (2014) **Mike Slaughter**. Be a renegade for the true Jesus. Central to the Christian faith is a man who denies all our pre-conceived notions about what God should look like. Joining his movement will mean coming to terms with the real Jesus, the rebel Jesus. *6 sessions, compelling reading; should prompt lively discussion. Materials include: 1 book.*

232 ***Seven Words: Listening to Christ from the Cross*** (2020) **Susan G. Robb**. A person's final remarks are often their most intimate and revealing. In this 6-week biblical and historical Lenten study, experience awe-inspiring reflections on Jesus' "seven last words," spoken from the cross. His most vulnerable moment reveals Jesus' deepest love for us, his fullest humanity, and his surest trust in the Father. *Materials include: 5 books, 4 leader guides and is available on Amplify Media.*

232 ***Toward the Cross*** (2022) **Taylor W. Mills with Gary Thompson and Michelle Morris**. Let Jesus, not the world, set the priorities of your heart in this Lenten season. *Toward the Cross* challenges each of us to answer the question that lies at the heart of discipleship, at the heart of our priorities: Is following Jesus the most important thing to you? Is it your priority? When you follow Jesus, how does it change the way you think, speak, and act? Jesus told would-be followers to count the cost. The chapters and daily readings in this book help you do that by developing a disciple's perspective on yourself, others, and things. They encourage you to let go of the past, guilt, and things that weigh you down and cling tightly to Christ in genuine discipleship. *Materials include: 1 book.*

232.9 ***Entering the Passion of Jesus: A Beginner's Guide to Holy Week*** (2018) biblical scholar **Amy-Jill Levine** delves into the history and literature surrounding the last days of Jesus' life. She sets the narrative in historical context and analyzes the risks and motives of the story's characters. *Materials include: 1 book and 1 leader guide.*

232.9 ***Jesus Is the Question: The 307 Questions Jesus Asked and the 3 He Answered*** (2014) **Martin B. Copenhaver**. We often hear the overused phrase "Jesus is the answer." What if Jesus is the question? That might change everything. Contrary to common assumptions, Jesus is not the ultimate Answer Man, but more like the Great Questioner. In the Gospels, Jesus asks many more questions than he answers. In this book, Martin B. Copenhaver considers these questions of Jesus - and what they imply about following him. *Materials include: 2 books with a reader's guide.*

232.9 ***The Journey*** (2011/2021) **Adam Hamilton** travels from Nazareth to Bethlehem in a fascinating look at the birth of Jesus Christ. He approaches a world-changing event with thoughtfulness. Using historical information, archaeological data, and a personal look at some of the stories surrounding the birth, the most amazing moment in history will become more real and heart-felt as you walk along this road. An excellent study for Advent. *Materials include: 4 books, 1 leader guide, 1 DVD and available on Amplify Media.*

232.9 ***What's the Least I can Believe and Still Be a Christian?*** (2013) Pastor and author **Martin Thielen** has compiled a list of ten things people need to believe, and ten things they don't, to be a Christian. This lively and engaging book will be a help to seekers as well as a comfort to believers who may find themselves questioning some of the assumptions they grew up with. And while we must always take the Bible seriously, we don't always have to take it literally. At the same time, Christians do need to believe in Jesus--his life, his teachings, his death and resurrection, and his vision for the world. A great benefit of those beliefs is that they provide promising answers to life's most profound questions. *Materials include: 1 book with study guide.*

232.9 ***Who Is This Man? The Unpredictable Impact of the Inescapable Jesus*** (2012) **John Ortberg** shares how Jesus' influence has swept over history and how his vision of life continues to impact humanity today. *Materials include: 5 sessions, 2 books and 1 DVD.*

232.92 ***The Women of Christmas: Experience the Season Afresh with Elizabeth, Mary, and Anna.*** (2013) Best-selling author **Liz Curtis Higgs** explores the biblical stories of Elizabeth, Mary, and Anna, unwrapping each verse with tender care and introducing you afresh to The Women of Christmas. A sacred season is about to unfold for three women whose hearts belong to God. Elizabeth is barren, yet her trust in God remains fertile. Mary is betrothed in marriage, yet she is willing to bear God's Son. Anna is a widow full of years, yet she waits patiently, prayerfully for the Messiah to appear in the temple courts. He retraces the day that changed human history in his usual straightforward yet easy, conversational style that speaks to both long-time Christians and those who are simply curious about the story of Christ's crucifixion. *Materials include: 1 book.*

233.5 ***Laugh Your Way to Grace: Reclaiming the Spiritual Power of Humor*** (2016) In this personal and funny look at humor as a spiritual practice, **Rev. Susan Sparks** - an ex-lawyer turned comedian and Baptist minister - presents a convincing case that the power of humor radiates far beyond punch lines. Recommended by FPC Health Ministries. *Materials include: 4 books.*

233.5 ***Love, a Tiara, and a Cupcake: Three Secrets to Finding Happy*** (2021) **Rev. Susan Sparks.** How do you hold onto hope in the midst of despair? The answer is simple! All you need is love, a tiara, and a cupcake. Using these three festive metaphors, this book offers heart-warming meditations on finding your purpose (love), claiming your worth (a tiara), and holding onto your joy (a cupcake) - tools that can get you through the worst of times. Join Rev. Susan Sparks to welcome joy into your life no matter what the circumstances. *Materials include: 3 books.*

234 ***What's So Amazing About Grace?*** (1997) Grace is the church's great distinctive. It's the one thing the world cannot duplicate, and the one thing it craves above all else, for only grace can bring hope and transformation to a jaded world. In *What's So Amazing About Grace?* author **Philip Yancey** explores grace at street level. If grace is God's love for the undeserving, then what does it look like in action? Naming our sins allows us to move from guilt to grace. Provocative discussion, 3 chapters, probably 4 sessions). *Materials include: 4 books.*

234.1 ***Signs and Wonders: A Beginners Guide to the Miracles of Jesus*** (2022) **Amy Jill Levine** explores selected miracles of Jesus in historical and theological context. For each miracle, she discusses not only how past witnesses would have understood the events, but also how today's readers can draw meaning from Jesus's words and actions. *Materials include: 1 book and 1 leader guide.*

241 ***Defining Moments: When Choices Matter Most*** (2006) **Dan Schaeffer** looks at the defining moments of some biblical characters and tells us what pitfalls to avoid. You'll identify with the heroes of the Bible in ways you never have before. *Materials include: 11 sessions, a book with discussion questions.*

241 ***Next Door Savior*** (2006) **Max Lucado** presents the stunning contrasts of Jesus - his irresistible humanity and undeniable deity. You'll see, as never before, a complete picture of our Lord. Great for seekers and non-believers! An inspirational study of the incarnation. *Materials include: 8 sessions, book, leader guide & DVD.*

241.3 ***Sinning Like a Christian: A New Look at the Seven Deadly Sins*** (2005) **William H. Willimon** brings his blunt, eloquent, and humorous style to bear on the question of sin. His penetrating observations will be welcomed by readers who are dissatisfied with shallow, feel-good Christianity that does not attempt to grapple with our propensity to do evil. *Materials include: 2 books with 8 chapters & discussion questions in the back of the book.*

241.4 ***Confronting the Controversies: Biblical Perspectives on Tough Issues*** (2005) **Adam Hamilton**. The study is designed as a "fishing expedition," with tools and helps that will enable people to make the study a church and community-wide outreach event. *Materials include: 7 sessions. Kit with Pastor's guide, 4 leader guides, 3 books, 2 DVDs.*

241.4 ***Experiencing Contagious Joy*** (2006) **Christa Kinde**. Joy has a way of working its way from the inside out. When our lives are filled with joy, the symptoms are unmistakable. It means you have run out of options. It isn't true. We have a prayer. Often relegated to recitation and to ritual, the Lord's Prayer is a treasure of ancient wisdom. It teaches us how to pray. It offers a path to growth as a human being, and a guide to building and deepening relationships. The prayer is structured as seven conversations with God. There is room within its frame for us to pray about what is urgent or pressing in our life, even as we are invited to take a step back. The guided conversations are about seven critical dimensions that shape our experience of life: **Perspective, Hope, Trust, our wants and needs here and now, Forgiveness and Generosity, Self-awareness, Gratitude.** *Materials include: 1 book. 248 ***Knit One, Pearl Two*** (2010) **Laura Thompson.** Ladies of all ages will enjoy this unique study of God's Word which takes lessons learned by a knitter and applies them to daily living. *Materials include: 1 book.*

248 ***NOOMA*** (2008) **Rob Bell.** Things don't always work out the way we want them to, or the way we think they will. We get hit with some form of pain out of nowhere leaving us feeling desperate and helpless. That's the way life is. Still, it makes us wonder how God can let these things happen to us. Where is God when it really hurts? Maybe God is closer to us than we think. Maybe it's when we're in these situations, where everything seems to be falling apart, that God gets an opportunity to remind us of how much he really loves us. *Materials include: 23 DVDs on relevant topics.*
