### *Joyful Worship and Gracious Invitation*

- **Join us for worship** on Sundays at [fpchhi.org](http://fpchhi.org). Today is the third Sunday in a five-week sermon and worship series we're calling "Living our Values." It's based on our Values of Ministry (which are the headings printed in italics on this page).
- **Next Sunday, October 4, we'll celebrate communion** as believers united in Christ, even while separated. We'll do that by providing communion sets (i.e., a common bread and cup) that you may pick-up for you and your family at the church office this week from Monday-Friday between 9 AM-4 PM. Each set has a prefilled juice cup and a communion wafer. A gluten-free option is also available. Alternatively, we invite you to have bread and juice available so you can partake of this sacrament with us from your own home.
- And join our pastors for a **prayer service this Wednesday at noon in James Chapel**. Registration is required (at [fpchhi.org/weekly-highlights](http://fpchhi.org/weekly-highlights)) due to limited seating, and masks are required (they'll be available if you don't have one). Please enter through the double doors to the church office.
- **A Season of Peace:** This is the final week of a four-week spiritual journey that began on September 6-October 4. The daily devotions have been written specifically for this year and focus on practicing peace within, peace in relationships and in community, and holistic peace. The devotions invite the Spirit to strengthen and support us in shared life and ministry.
